Ten top tips for reading stories to your child

- 1 Make reading to your child feel like a treat. Introduce each new book with excitement.
- 2 Make it a special quiet time and cuddle up so both of you can see the book.
- 3 Show curiosity in what you're going to read: Oh no! I think Arthur is going to get even angrier now.
- Read the whole story first time through without stopping too much. If you think your child might not understand something, model an explanation.
 Oh I think what's happening here is that.....
- 5 Chat about the story: I wonder why he did that? Oh no, I hope she's not going to..... I wouldn't have done that, would you?
- 6 Avoid asking questions to test what your child remembers.
- 7 Link stories to your own experiences (e.g. The reminds me of ...)
- 8 Read favourite stories over and over again. Get your child to join in with the bits they know.
- 9 Read with enthusiasm. Don't be embarrassed to try out different voices. Your child will love it.
- 10 Read with enjoyment. If you're enjoying it, your child will too.







Exciting news! After half term, we will be running a series of parent workshops which will focus on fact fluency. Fact fluency is a fundamental foundation for maths learning.

Why is Math Fact Fluency Important?

- contributes to students' ability to solve more difficult problems quicker and more accurately.
- leads to success in students' future mathematics courses and careers.
- builds confidence in students' math ability.

Each year group will have the opportunity to work with their parent/ carer, and teacher, sharing ideas of how these skills can be further developed at home.


