Dear Parents,

Another busy week is coming to a close at Green Meadow. We have been delighted to see so many amazing examples of home learning this week. It always amazes us to see how creative the children are in interpreting the ideas for home learning on our topic knowledge organisers. The children are so enthused by their topic learning and are able to talk in detail about how their learning is coming to life through their experiences. They really are taking on the challenge of Oracy October and talking like experts! To start this term, we held a combined art and personal deveopment project focusing on expressing identity and community as a theme, with each class looking at a key book and artist. The resulting artwork has been displayed around school this week and looks absolutely amazing. We simply can't wait to showcase it for you on parent's evening.

We are looking forward to welcoming parents into school after half term for our first parents consultation evenings of this academic year, on Wednesday 2nd and Thursday 3rd November. There will be more details of how to book appointments with your child's class teacher coming out next week. If your child has Special Educational Needs and/or Disabilities, you can also book a separate appointment with Miss Perry, our SENDCo, to discuss provision for your child and to review their individual targets.

On the theme of SEND, Miss Perry will be hosting a coffee morning on Monday 17th October form 9am, along with James Crompton from the Local Authority Access to Education team Pupil and School Support. The purpose of the morning is to review the school's current SEND Information Report and to gain the insight of parents in how we can make the report accessible and representative of the support we can offer here at Green Meadow for different types of need. If you are interested in coming along, please see Miss Perry's message later in this newsletter on how to book your place.

Also on the theme of inclusion and provision, we wanted to let you know about a fantastic initiative we have been involved with. Developing Local Provision (DLP) is a key part of the SEND improvement programme in Birmingham. It is a two year project which aims to, track, monitor and improve progress and outcomes for children and young people with additional needs or Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) in mainstream schools across the city. Additional funding over 2 years, has been provided to enable schools to work together to proactively identify the needs of children and young people across partnerships of schools and provide resources and support required to meet those needs earlier. ATTENDANCE UPDATES

Leave of absence (including holidays during term time)

Parents and carers should make every effort to avoid taking pupils out of education fo holidays or other extended leave during term time. The school will only authorise a leave of absence during term time where there are exceptional circumstances.

To request a leave of absence, parents/carers must make the request in advance and in writing and, wherever possible, at least 4 school weeks ahead of the planned leave.

Where a leave of absence is requested as above, the Head of School will consider the specific facts and circumstances relating to the request. The decision:

- will be confirmed in writing
- is solely at Head of School's discretion
- is final.

Where permission is granted, the Head of School will confirm the number of days and dates of absence which are authorised.

If permission is not granted and the parents/carers proceed to take their child out of school, the absence will be marked as unauthorised and parents may be issued with a penalty notice or be subject to prosecution by the local authority.

Reception September 2023 School Applications

Applications opened on 1 October 2022 for primary school applications for entry in September 2023. **The closing date is 15** January 2023 at 11:59pm.

You must apply on time. If you apply late, you are less likely to get offered a place at any of your preferred schools. Applications received after 15 January 2023 will be classed as late applications and will not be processed until after the offer of places on 17 April 2023.

Remember to list three different primary schools. Important: Make sure you include details of any siblings attending your preferred school(s) in the field (box) provided for sibling details. Sibling details included in the incorrect field (box), such as in reasons for preference, will not be counted and may prevent you from gaining a place at your preferred school. Please note if you fill in the online application incorrectly, you are responsible for not completing the form correctly, not School Admissions and Fair Access Service.

School meals are £2.35 per day, payable via Arbor, for years 3, 4, 5 \$ 6, unless you are entitled to free school meals.

Please note that for Reception, Year I and Year 2 <u>ALL</u> children are entitled to universal free school meals.
