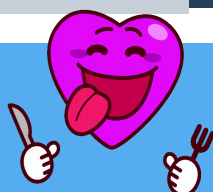
# HOT CHOCOLATE FRIDAY

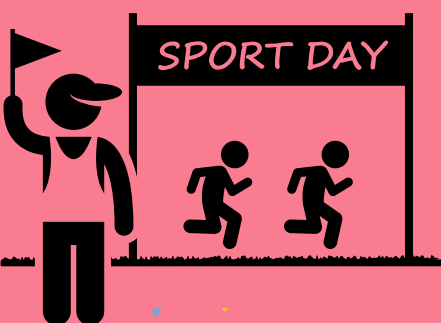

# Queen's Jubilee



We cannot wait to celebrate the Queen's 70th Jubilee on Friday 27th May 2022. All the children and staff will be invited to wear red, white and blue on the day. Miss Bonner's Year 5 and 6 choir are busy learning the Jubilee anthem, 'Rise Up and Serve'.

The fabulous kitchen team will prepare a picnic lunch in union flag lunch boxes (you have already received communication from school about how to order your Jubilee Picnic). If the weather is fine, we hope to have a picnic outside on the field.

There will be a build up to the celebration day with a focus on the Jubilee in the Monday No Outsiders assembly, the class-based assemblies and the 'think about' slides during the week beginning Monday 23rd May. There will also be an additional assembly on Friday 27th where the Year 5 and 6 Jubilee Choir will perform.

Each year group will focus on a decade from the Queen's reign during their learning on Friday 27th. The children will look at key events from the period, particularly those relating to the Queen.

Throughout the week every class will be producing Jubilee artwork, with KS1 joining the live Jubilee draw-along online with Steve Antony, author/illustrator of 'The Queen's Hat'. KS2 will be making stamps depicting the Queen throughout the decades of her reign. Look out on Twitter to see some fantastic learning!

**ACCEPTING**

Accepting emails, IM messages, or opening files, pictures or texts from people you don't know or trust can lead to problems – they may contain viruses or nasty messages!



R

**RELIABLE**

Information you find on the internet may not be true, or someone online may be lying about who they are.



T

**TELL**

Tell your parent, carer or a trusted adult if someone or something makes you feel uncomfortable or worried, or if you or someone you know is being bullied online.
